Teach for America offers programs and paid internships for undergraduates throughout the year, and are open to DACA recipients (read this statement about their support for DACA). Teach for America also offers an opportunity to teach for 2-years post-graduation. Corps members come from hundreds of universities, represent dozens of college majors, and have countless experiences that contribute to success in the classroom. In order to be considered for admission to the TFA corps, you must have a bachelor's degree with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50 and U.S. citizenship, national/legal resident status, or be a DACA recipient. There are 5 opportunities/year to apply.
